ABNA 2021 ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Earlier this week the ABNA Management Committee and Conference Organising Committee announced the 18th annual ABNA conference will go ahead as a 1-day hybrid event on Thursday 21st October 2021.

Delegates will be invited to join their local hub (Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide, Brisbane or Perth) for a day of themed sessions with keynote talks, biobanking news and discussions relating to biobanking during a pandemic. Each hub will dial into the central conference to ensure that all participants, online and virtual, receive full event coverage.

Talks and posters are invited. Posters will be displayed on the conference website and 6 posters chosen for rapid-fire talks presented at the speaker's local hub and broadcast to the wider virtual attendees at other hubs. There will be prizes for: best presentation, best rapid-fire talk and best poster.

Key Dates:

- A detailed program will be released on July 1st 2021
- Abstract submissions will open from August 1st to October 1st 2021
- There is an option for off-site virtual attendance, but speakers must be present in a hub to ensure a smooth event. International speakers can attend virtually.
- Early-bird registration costs (available from July until October 1st):
 - Hub attendance* for members/non-members: \$100/\$125
 - Virtual attendance for members/non-members: \$50/\$75
 - *Hub attendance includes morning tea, lunch & afternoon tea. In the Perth hub, brunch will be the main meal due to time differences.
- · Registration opening dates will be updated on our website

Should COVID restrictions prevent hub attendance, fees will be reduced to virtual attendance via refunds. The number of attendee allowable at each hub will be limited and space will be allocated on a first come first filled basis.


A conference dinner will be arranged at each hub so please keep an eye on our conference website for further details.
